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Description

- Rivendell is a K-12 Private Satellite Program (PSP) located in Fremont, California.
- Students are enrolled in a private independent study program.
- Families select and purchase their own curriculum and provide instruction.
- Rivendell offers tutoring and school counseling, but does not offer direct instruction.
- All students have a California residential address.
- Rivendell is not accredited.

Grading System and Related Procedures

- High school credits and grades from other schools are transferred directly.
- Grades from third-party providers are used where provided.
- Parents provide grades for parent-taught courses.
- Minimum passing grade: 60% = D-. Grades of 59% and below = F.
- Cumulative GPA is calculated on a 4.00 scale.
- Honors and College Board approved AP courses are weighted +1 grade point.
- Dual enrolled college courses are weighted +1 grade point and assigned 10 high school credits (1 year) per 3-5 semester unit course.
- Class rank is not reported.

- English Language Arts (30 credits)
- Mathematics (20 credits)
- Social Studies (30 credits)
- Sciences (20 credits)
- Physical Education or Health (20 credits)

Curriculum Description for Middle and High School

Rivendell families of students in grades 7-12 agree to provide instruction in the following course of study using the curriculum and methods of their choice:

- **English Language Arts**, including world literature, composition, critical analysis, and debate.
- **Mathematics**, including operational skills, problem-solving, financial literacy, statistical concepts, geometry concepts, and algebra concepts.
- **Social Studies**, including history, geography, world cultures, and civics.
- **Ethnic Studies**, examining race, ethnicity, and indigeneity, with a focus on the experiences of people of color.
- **Sciences**, including biological and physical sciences such as biology, chemistry, and physics.
- **World Languages**, including languages other than English such as modern foreign languages, classical languages, or American Sign Language.
- **Computer Literacy**, including computer maintenance, online safety, internet search skills, email management, word processing, spreadsheets, presentation software, and programming.
- **Visual and Performing Arts**, including dance, music, theater, and visual arts such as drawing, painting, sculpture, graphic arts or photography.
- **Practical Arts**, including study skills, food preparation and safety, driver education, home maintenance, career technical education, industrial arts, business education, or agriculture.
- **Health**, including human development topics such as mental health, human sexuality, family planning, and parenting skills.
- **Physical Education**, including physical activities such as swimming, bicycling, or sports.
